The Arabian Breeders World Cup (ABWC) event returns to the South Point Equestrian Complex for the tenth consecutive year. The show is a celebration of the Arabian breed and the lifestyle associated with owning Arabian show horses. Worthy of its location on the glitzy Las Vegas Strip, the Equestrian Center is rated as the finest indoor horse facility in the country and hosts some of the most prestigious equestrian events in the world.

The Arabian Horse Breeders Alliance (AHBA) is a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting the Arabian horse. The group is a worldwide community of breeders united in their passion and devotion to the Arabian, promoting thoughtful guardianship for future generations of these magnificent horses.

The Arabian Breeders World Cup 2017 plans for another blowout celebration. As one of the world's premier purebred Arabian horse shows, this international competition garners global entries; over 26 countries are represented annually. For our first show weekend we will be holding a clinic with Tim Goggins which is planned to take place on Saturday, May 20th at REACH .

1. This will be a pre-paid entry event so once the entry form is posted you can fill in the necessary parts and mail in with the correct fee.
 2. Since we have a minimum of 4 hours I that we divide that time into 4 equal time slots. (Thinking up to 5 participants per time slot)
 - a) Hunter Pleasure or better called English Pleasure as per our class list.
 - b) Western Pleasure
 - c) Equitation and Showmanship
 - d) Overall Horsemanship
 3. Since Tim is currently a recognized judge with AHA we might want to have questions prepared regarding some rules and what it is that the judge is looking for in a class.
 4. If time at the end of each session we could have a question and answer time.
